Carolina Fire Academy and has been a firefighter at Gantt Fire Department for



The emphasis for student ministry in 2008-2009 is evangelism. We want our students to become servant leaders and to be equipped in sharing their faith with

those in their sphere of influence. How can God accomplish this task? To begin with, He is already moving our students in this direction. The missions experience last summer in St. Louis motivated our students to share their faith. God broke our students' hearts for the Roma people who are commonly referred to as Gypsies and are seen throughout the world as the "least of these." They do not have the basic rights that all people should be given. However, we have the opportunity to show them their heavenly right, and that is to become a child of God.

July 3-12, 2009, our senior high and college students have the opportunity to share the Gospel with the Roma people in Thessaloniki, Greece, through a partnership with M-Fuge and International World Changers. This will provide our students the opportunity to see Christians living out their faith in another culture and also allow them to live out their faith in another culture.

When I was 19, I was given the privilege to go overseas for a mission trip. God used that trip to change my life forever and opened my eyes to the church that was outside of my small town. God confirmed His call on my life and from that point forward I knew that my life would be spent serving Him. This is an opportunity of a lifetime for these students and this investment could change their lives forever.

Will you consider partnering with our students on this mission trip? Here are some ways that you can partner with us.

- 1. The most important way is to pray. Please make it part of your life to pray for all aspects of this mission trip. John Bunyan said, "You can do more than pray after you have prayed, but you cannot do more than pray until after you have prayed."
