

Greetings in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ!

From the Today is Ash Wednesday. This means that yesterday Partier was Fat Tuesday in the Catholic Mardi Gras tradition. Mardi Gras has been perverted and twisted to please

Satan and shame Christ. A little history: Mardi Gras was traditionally the French Catholic celebration of the beginning of Lent, the forty-day season of preparation for the remembrance and celebration of the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Traditionally, during Lent people would give up something for those forty days that they enjoyed and replace it with some service or devotion to Christ. Mardi Gras is French for Fat Tuesday. On the Tuesday before the beginning of Lent, French Catholics would gorge themselves with whatever it was they were vowing to give up during Lent. This tradition was first begun in the United States in 1703 in Mobile, Alabama, but New Orleans has become famous for it. In 1703, it was probably much more sincere than what it has become today.

Today, it has become an excuse for people (not just Catholics) to party on Fat Tuesday. The people who attend the modern day celebration of Mardi Gras must really have a lifestyle of debauchery because it has become a party with an emphasis upon illicit sex and binge drinking.

Allow me to propose an alternative to the traditional approach to Mardi Gras. Instead of giving up something for forty days preceding Holy Week, why don't we commit ourselves to doing something for Christ for the forty days prior to Holy Week? If you do not currently have a quiet time with God, begin one today and continue it throughout the season of Lent. My guess is that you will continue that sweet time with God. We could read the gospels during those forty days. Another idea might be to commit to share the gospel with at least one person every day for those forty days. Why don't we reclaim a season intended for Christ but stolen by Satan and truly make it a time of preparation for Easter?
