Greetings in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ!

Yesterday, March 17, was St. Patrick's Day. So why do we celebrate this holiday?

According to the website, History.com, St. Patrick was the patron Saint of Ireland. The website refutes

the legend that he banished all of the snakes from Ireland; but they do believe that he was a real person, born in Britain, and died on March 17, 460 A.D. When he was sixteen, he was allegedly taken prisoner by the Irish and transported there where he became a devout Christian. Following his escape from his captivity, he returned to Britain, where God sent him back to Ireland (this time as a missionary).

The interesting thing about St. Patrick and what makes his ministry relevant to us, is that in his mission work in Ireland, he worked in and through the culture. He didn't attempt to eradicate the traditional Celtic beliefs; rather he used those traditions to introduce Christianity to the people. For example, he used bonfires to celebrate Easter because the Celtics were used to honoring their gods with fire. He also incorporated an image of the sun into the traditional Christian cross, forming what we know today as the Celtic cross. Although he probably did not introduce Christianity to Ireland (as tradition says), he was, no doubt, very successful in growing the number of believers there.

While remaining true to the Word of God, we too must be relevant to our culture. We can be faithful to Christ and His Word without being legalistic about our faith and values. With that strategy, we can successfully work to further the spread of the gospel. In fact, that strategy has been repeated successfully in many other cultures (Korea, China, Africa, the United States, etc) since the 5th century!

I look forward to growing with you in Sunday School and worshipping with you in church!
