

Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ!

Last week was our Week of Prayer for International Missions, however I want us to keep praying! Throughout December, let me encourage you to continue to pray for people all around the world.

Pray for the people of northern India. Pray for Moses, who after praying to receive Christ at the age of seventeen has steadily grown in his faith and is now a powerful, yet persecuted, evangelist in northern India. Pray that God will give boldness and protection to Moses and other believers in northern India as they share their faith. "Time is short," Moses says. "I must go, pray and preach the Gospel."

Pray of the people of Ethiopia. Christian workers, Renee and Ed (names changed), have dedicated their lives to sharing the Good News with the people of Ethiopia. More than 90 percent are illiterate and unable to read the Bible in their own language. Pray for Renee and Ed as they build relationships with the people and share that the only way to heaven is through God's Son, Jesus. Pray the people Renee and Ed meet in Ethiopia will be open and receptive to the friendship and message of hope they offer. Pray that more workers will be called to help spread the Gospel message.

Pray for the Lezghi people. Fear of the supernatural is part of daily life for the Lezghi people, who make their homes in the Caucasus Mountains of Central Asia and Eastern Europe. Though they profess to be Muslim, nearly all Lezghi wear amulets or charms to ward off evil spirits; broken teapots hung from homes and thorns hung from vehicles' rearview mirrors serve the same purpose. Holy places called pirs (pronounced peers) provide Lezghis a place to offer sacrifices and consult witch doctors to garner favor with spirits. Most of the more than 650,000 Lezghis have never heard the Gospel. Southern Baptist workers, Carl and Amy Stroller (names changed), from Wake Forest, N.C., are working to change that. Pray that God will open the hearts of the Lezghi and protect the Strollers from discouragement.

As you pray for these people, pray also for the amount that God would give through you for us to reach and exceed our Lottie Moon Christmas offering goal for international missions.

I look forward to growing with you in Sunday School and worshipping with you in church!


