Greetings in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ!

We have all been taken back with the massive disaster in Haiti as well as our own personal losses at Northgate. Sometimes we feel overwhelmed with grief that goes

along with the burdens of life. One thing (other than my faith in God and His Word) that helps me to cope with such loss is to look at disaster and heartache in the scope of history. One such story is the story of Dresden, Germany, during World War II.

Dresden was the seventh largest city in Germany during World War II. It lies just west of the Polish and Czech Republic borders. Dresden was not a highly strategic city in Nazi Germany's war machine; however, it did have rail lines that ferried Nazi soldiers to the Eastern front and some factories that supported the Nazi war effort which, in the eyes of Allied leaders, made the city a legitimate military target. In one of the most controversial acts of the war, the British and American Air Forces bombed Dresden on February 13 and 14, 1945. The controversy centered not on the bombing of military targets such as the rail lines and factories (they had been bombed previously in the war); but that the civilian population at the city's center was bombed horrendously so late in the war when the war's outcome was no longer in doubt. The population of the city was swollen with refugees fleeing the approaching Russian Army to the point that no historian knows just how many people were in Dresden at the time of the bombing. Estimates of the casualties range from 35,000 to 500,000 killed. To make matters worse, many of the bombs dropped were incendiary bombs creating a firestorm that literally melted the streets and removed the oxygen from the air. Scientists and historians estimate that the surface temperature at the city's center reached eighteen hundred degrees Fahrenheit. In all, through three main waves of bombings, over 3,300 tons of bombs were dropped on that city.

It is easiest for us to simply resign the tragedy of Dresden to the horrors of war, but the reality is that each one of those killed had loved ones. The same heaviness of heart lies with us now as we try to grasp the mass devastation in Haiti, a nation already severely impoverished and the personal loss of several of our families and friends. Losses like these transcend our ability to understand and we are left with the only answer we have. Isaiah 55:8 – "For My thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways My ways," says the LORD."

I look forward to growing with you in Sunday School and worshipping with you in church.
