Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ!

On March 3, 1931, Congress voted to make the Star Spangled Banner our national anthem. I find that to be very interesting. What was happening in March 1931? Our nation was in the depths of a great economic crisis – "The Great Depression."

People were concerned and unsure about their future.

Many of you know that the Star Spangled Banner wasn't a song at all when Francis Scott Key wrote it on September 16, 1814; it was a poem. The lyrics of that poem were set to popular song in British and American bars and pubs at the time. It was a drinking song entitled, "The Anacreontic Song." Anacreontics are verses in a meter first used by Greek poet, Anacreon. Anacreon was famous for his poems about love and wine. Think about it, our national anthem has its roots in a poem and song that was associated with drinking and a part of the bar scene in the early nineteenth century. Many of our greatest and most popular Christian hymns have similar origins.

When we take a look at the lyrics of our national anthem, we can see why our government's leaders would want to move to make it our "official" song. The song has four verses. We sing the first one before every major sporting event and in church on patriotic holidays. Listen to the last verse:

Oh! thus be it ever, when freemen shall stand
Between their loved home and the war's desolation!
Blest with vict'ry and peace, may the heav'n rescued land
Praise the Power that hath made and preserved us a nation.
Then conquer we must, when our cause it is just,
And this be our motto: "In God is our trust."
And the star-spangled banner in triumph shall wave
O'er the land of the free and the home of the brave!

Interestingly Francis Scott Key wanted, "In God We Trust" to be our national motto in 1814. It went on our money beginning in 1864 and on all our coins by 1938. In 1956, congress voted to adopt "In God We Trust" as our official motto.
