Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ!

According to his website, "H. W. Brands was born in Oregon, went to college in California, sold cutlery across the American West, and earned graduate degrees in mathematics and history in Oregon and Texas. He taught at Vanderbilt University and Texas A&M University

before joining the faculty at the University of Texas at Austin, where he is the Dickson Allen Anderson Centennial Professor of History. He writes on American history and politics, with books including Traitor to His Class, Andrew Jackson, The Age of Gold, The First American, and TR. Several of his books have been bestsellers; two, Traitor to His Class and The First American, were finalists for the Pulitzer Prize. He lectures frequently on historical and current events, and can be seen and heard on national and international television and radio programs. His writings have been translated into Spanish, French, German, Russian, Chinese, Japanese, and Korean."

Over the next several weeks, I am going to be sharing segments from a collection of essays Dr. Brands has written and compiled in a journal entitled, *Lincoln's Genius*. On page 6, Brands wrote in the essay entitled, "Genius in the Making," "There was nothing inevitable or preordained about [President] Lincoln's success. He based critical decisions on incomplete information, and he could never be sure he was doing the right thing. When he discovered he wasn't, he altered course and carried on. If there was a secret to his ultimate triumph, it was his ability to learn from his mistakes before they overwhelmed him and the country. Lincoln's genius wasn't innate; it was acquired, through the hardest experience any American president ever endured."

When I reflect upon those words pertaining to perhaps our greatest president, I think about Paul's words to the Philippian church. "Not that I have already attained, or am already perfected; but I press on, that I may lay hold of that for which Christ Jesus has also laid hold of me. Brethren, I do not count myself to have apprehended; but one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind and reaching forward to those things which are ahead, I press toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus. Therefore let us, as many as are mature, have this mind; and if in anything you think otherwise, God will reveal even this to you. Nevertheless, to the degree that we have already attained, let us walk by the same rule, let us be of the same mind" (Phil. 3:12-16).

As we make our way through the Christian life, let's remain committed to following biblical principles and trust God to accomplish in us His will and bring us to His desired end.

I look forward to growing with you in Sunday School and worshipping with you in church.
