Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ!

We have been considering H.W. Brands' reflections on Abraham Lincoln in his collection of essays entitled, *Lincoln's Genius*. On page

14, Brands wrote, "Lincoln refused to be deterred. Having made his choice, he plunged ahead. He addressed the convention calmly, scarcely raising his voice. But the content of his phrases couldn't have been louder." [Lincoln said] "A house divided against itself cannot stand. I believe that this government cannot endure permanently half slave and half free." "This was explosive language, and Lincoln knew it. He let the message sink in as he [Lincoln] elaborated":

I do not expect the Union to be dissolved. I do not expect the house to fall. But I do expect it will cease to be divided. It will become all one thing, or all the other. Either the opponents of slavery will arrest the future spread of it, and place it where the public mind shall rest in the belief that it is in the course of ultimate extinction; or its advocates will push it forward, till it shall become alike lawful in all the states, old as well as new, North as well as South.

Dr. Brands' genius is in illustrating how *Lincoln's Genius* evolved through tenacious conviction; a conviction that Lincoln found in the words of Christ. "And if a house is divided against itself, that house cannot stand" (Mk 3:25). Dr. Brands continued, "Lincoln's words stole the breath from his Springfield listeners, who wondered what the modest man they had known had become such a bomb-thrower. They stared, rapt, as he drove on to his finish. The slaveholder plot must be resisted, Lincoln said, and it would be defeated."

The gospel of Jesus Christ transforms us from a self-centered hoarder to a God-centered giver and the basis of that transformation is a conviction that Jesus is the Christ. The gospel transforms us from fearful victims to fearless victors! "For God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power and of love and of a sound mind" (2 Tim 1:7). It is with Christ's confidence that we stand with the apostle Paul and say, "If God is for us, who can be against us?"

I look forward to growing with you in Sunday School and worshipping with you in church.


