Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus

We have been considering H.W. Brands' reflections on Abraham Lincoln in his collection of essays entitled, *Lincoln's Genius*. In one of the most famous speeches ever delivered, the *Gettysburg Address*, Abraham Lincoln said:

"Fourscore and seven years ago our fathers brought forth on this continent, a new nation, conceived in Liberty, and dedicated to the proposition that all men are created equal. Now we are engaged in a great civil war, testing whether that nation or any other nation so conceived and so dedicated, can long endure. We are met on a great battlefield of that war. We have come to dedicate a portion of that field as a final resting place for those who gave their lives that that nation might live. It is altogether fitting and proper that we should do this. But, in a larger sense, we cannot dedicate – we cannot consecrate – we cannot hallow – this ground. The brave men, living and dead, who struggled here, have consecrated it, far above our poor power to add or detract. The world will little note, nor long remember what we say here, but it can never forget what they did here. It is for us the living, rather, to be dedicated here to the unfinished work which they who fought here thus far so nobly advanced. It is rather for us to be here dedicated to the great task remaining before us – that from these honored dead we take increased devotion to that cause for which they gave the last full measure of devotion – that we here highly resolve that these dead shall not have died in vain – that this nation, under God, shall have a new birth of freedom – and that government of the people, by the people, for the people, shall not perish from the earth."

Dr. Brands wrote in his essay, *They did Not Die In Vain* (p.57), "Fighting for the Union allowed much, but fighting for humanity allowed almost anything. In fewer than 300 words and less than three minutes, Lincoln accomplished the

remarkable feat of not just redefining the Civil War but the meaning of American history – and of justifying his actions on history's behalf." In just six hours on a cross and one second of a glance into an empty tomb, Jesus Christ redefined history and humanity. He did not die in vain! He died to make humanity eternally free and He rose from the grave to offer us an abundant and eternal new life.

I look forward to growing with you in Sunday School and worshipping with you in church.
