Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus

We have been considering H.W. Brands' reflections on Abraham Lincoln in his collection of essays entitled, *Lincoln's Genius*.

In his essay, This General Can Fight (p.60), Dr. Brands wrote, "The war could have ended in the summer of 1863 if Lincoln had been a better judge of men. The Union victory at Vicksburg split the Confederacy in two, and Gettysburg blasted Southern hopes of making Northerners experience the war on their own soil. Lincoln could barely contain his anger and disappointment when General George Meade had Robert E. Lee and his Rebel troops pinned on the northern bank of the Potomac River after Gettysburg and let them slip away. 'If I had gone up there I could have whipped them myself,' Lincoln fumed. 'Our army held the war in the hallow of their hand, and they would not close it.' On reflection, however, Lincoln realized that the fault for the missed opportunity lay as much with him as with Meade. He had given Meade command of the Army of the Potomac barely 48 hours before the Gettysburg fight. Beating Lee in a set-piece contest was accomplishment enough for one so new to command; pursuing Lee, the master of maneuver, on the heels of the harrowing battle was more than Lincoln could reasonably ask."

Have you ever said something in anger to or about someone or passed judgment on someone and later regretted your words or deeds? We have all been guilty of that at some point in our lives. James gave some priceless advice concerning this common mistake. He said, "So then, my beloved brethren, let every man be swift to hear, slow to speak, slow to wrath; for the wrath of man does not produce the righteousness of God" (James 1:19-20).

I look forward to growing with you in Sunday School and worshipping with you in church.
