Greetings in the Name of our Lord Jesus Christ!

We have been considering H.W. Brands' reflections on Abraham Lincoln in his collection of essays entitled, *Lincoln's Genius*.

In his essay, *Trust the People's Will* (p.74), Dr. Brands wrote, "The outcome [of Lincoln's presidential reelection] vindicated Lincoln's longstanding faith in democracy, and his more recent faith in Providence. Even as he thanked voters, he also thanked God. 'All who have labored today in behalf of the Union organization,' he said as the victory was being tallied, 'have wrought for the best interests of their country and the world, not only for the present but for all future ages...I give thanks to the Almighty for this evidence of the people's resolution to stand by free government and the rights of humanity."

Abraham Lincoln was a man of many skills and talents; perhaps best was his ability to see what was needed and cast a vision to achieve it. It is a sad thing that it was relatively later in his life that he came to understand the role of God's Providence in all human affairs. He had a deep appreciation for the men who gave their lives on the field of battle and also for those who put themselves at risk that others might be free. As we celebrate Veterans Day, may we remember that we are "one nation under God" and that the service and sacrifice of our veterans have afforded us the opportunity to worship and give thanks as we should. Let me encourage you to do two things this week. First, thank God for our freedoms. Second, thank a veteran.
