

We have been examining an article written by Dr. Will McRaney, Jr. entitled, "5 Ways to Overcome a Fear of Witnessing." We will complete our review of this article this week.

Dr. McRaney wrote that the first thing we must do to overcome a fear of witnessing is to "Recognize that fear is natural, although we are seeking to live in the power of the supernatural." Another of his suggestions was, "We can recognize that fear is not from God but a tool of Satan." He added, "Love will disperse fear." Two weeks ago, we considered his fourth suggestion to help us overcome fear in witnessing: "Fear should drive us to a greater **dependence on God."** This week, I would like for us to consider Dr. McRaney's fifth and final suggestion for how we can overcome a fear of witnessing: "Fear should increase our desire to become more skilled in sharing Christ." He wrote, "My eldest daughter is a perfectionist. Her drive to get it right helps her now and will help her in the future. However, it creates frustration when she is learning a new skill. She wants to be perfect the first time. But playing volleyball and softball this year has taught her the importance of practice and repeated drills to perfect a skill. Several times early in the two seasons when she was having difficulty perfecting new skills she indicated that she wanted to quit. Thankfully, she heeded my advice that what she needed was patience with herself and repeated practice with the skills to perfect them. Though still somewhat impatient with herself, she has disciplined herself to extensive practice so that she might perform well. Fear can be used to drive us to develop sensitivities and skills in sharing the greatest story ever told."

Two of the disciplines that I have found to be helpful in evangelism is education and practice. I have availed myself to just about every evangelism training strategy available to Southern Baptists. I have studied: Evangelism Explosion; Continuing Witness Training; Share Jesus Without Fear; F.A.I.T.H.; G.R.O.W.; The One Day Soul Winning Workshop; The One Hour Soul Winning Workshop; The ABC's of Salvation; The Eternal Life Booklet Workshop, and many others. I have studied many, many different evangelism strategies and have learned a great deal from these educational experiences. In fact, they have all been excellent and very advantageous. However, I have also discovered that all of this education is of little effect if I fail to practice what I have learned. One thing I can say with all confidence; all of the programs that I mentioned above work and work very well. It is *doing* them that makes an eternity of difference! There is nothing like seeing someone trust Christ and be saved as a result of your faithful witness for Christ!

Please avail yourself to evangelism education <u>and practice</u>. You will see opportunities to improve your witness in the coming months through the ministries of Northgate Baptist Church.

The most important step in that process is to practice sharing your personal salvation story with as many different people as possible and as often as you can. Remember, the outline is very simple: 1.) My life before becoming a Christian. 2.) How I became a Christian. 3.) My life since becoming a Christian. Pray it. Write it. Practice it. Share it. Celebrate it.

I look forward to growing with you in Sunday School and worshipping with you in church.
