

I read an article on the *Fox Business* website recently that really made me think about the gospel, our culture, and a strategy to reach people. The article is entitled, "Seven Shopping Secrets Retailers Won't Tell You." It

was written by Naomi Mannino. She cites Dave Ramsey, Paco Underhill and Ellie Kay throughout her article.

We know that everything in any store is on purpose. Mannino's first "secret" is the "Magic of the Display." One scenario from Underhill is that a store buys t-shirts from Sri Lanka for \$3 and sews laundering instructions onto the shirts in French and English leading the consumer to think of France and increase the chance of an impulse purchase! We must be diligent and creative to reach people with the gospel, but never deceptive.

Another of her "secrets" is to be careful about "buy one, get one free" deals. She advises that consumers need to know their retailers, brands, regular prices, promotions, and discounts before making a purchase. She recommends that shopping for clearance items is the best plan. Christians must educate ourselves in the Scriptures so we know what we believe when we share the gospel (1 Peter 3:15).

She framed two "secrets" in regard to the clearance rack. There is a reason the clearance area is always messy. It takes time to find bargains and most shoppers don't have or take the time. Therefore, don't go shopping when you are in a hurry. Also, the clearance racks are nearly always in the back. The store makes us walk past the neatly folded and nicely displayed regular-priced items to gain access to the bargains. It takes discipline to shop smart. It also takes discipline to make witnessing a lifestyle and that begins with knowing and regularly sharing our testimony.

Two other of her "secrets" apply to our witness as well. Beware of the small stuff around the cash registers. Those things can be budget busters. Reject the impulse to take the bait! Rejection is a given in evangelism. Jesus was rejected. Paul was rejected. If we share the gospel, we are going to face rejection. Remember that rejection is temporal, separation from Christ is eternal. Retailers aren't stymied by rejection and we should not be either. Also, be careful with whom you shop. Obviously, we must interact with the unsaved in order to be an effective witness for Christ; but we must always be careful to influence and not be influenced by them.

I saved my favorite "secret" for last. "Don't turn right when entering a store." Mannino cites Underhill, "Retail shopping studies have found that most people turn right when they enter a store. That's because the majority of the population is right-handed and right-oriented." Minnino

adds, "Knowing this, stores highlight tempting new items and trends to the right of the entrance. You will find that the music is louder and displays are brighter to the right so you will be attracted in that direction first. This is where the most expensive items in the store are generally displayed." Everything in a retail store is intentional and on purpose. So should our witness for Christ be!


Envelopes are in your envelope packet and in the pews.
