#### From Our Pastor

On Martin Luther King, Jr. Day, I read again Dr. King's famous speech delivered in our nation's capital on August 28, 1963. I find great inspiration in his words and great truth in this speech. I would encourage you to spend some time, like I have done, reading the text of this great speech. I do not find the words of a victim; rather, I find words of a responsible leader reminding his followers that change is found not in playing the victim, but in being a peaceful agent of change. He communicated shared values and clearly pointed to common goals. Dr. King communicated vision in this speech.

Jim Kouzes and Barry Posner in their classic book, The Leadership Challenge, interviewed thousands of leaders and followers around the world for more than thirty years. They found that "Every organization, every social movement, begins with a dream. The dream or vision is the force that invents the future." George Barna in his book, The Power of Vision, defines vision as: "Vision for ministry is a clear mental image of a preferable future imparted by God to his chosen servants and is based upon an accurate understanding of God, self and circumstances." Aubrey Malphurs states in his book, Values -Driven Leadership, that "A vision has everything to do with the organization's direction. Many churches have no answer for the vision guestion. They have no idea where they are going; they are not aware that they even need a vision or a particular direction. While they have core values, the values are somewhat vague, diverse, and have never been clearly articulated. Hence these churches have no focus. Other churches have multiple visions they are attempting to move in several directions at the same time. This is a problem of competing core values."

Having read all three of the excellent books listed above (and everything that Barna and Malphurs have written), I find that Dr. King was a great leader because he had the ability to communicate leadership through vision. I appreciate Dr. King as a great American leader and celebrate his contributions to our nation. Furthermore, I am thankful that I have the privilege to lead a church that appreciates the value of vision. Vision allows us to set aside good things to accomplish what God has called us to do.

I look forward to growing with you in Sunday School and worshipping with you in church.


