I can never get Groundhog Day right. If the rodent sees his shadow (which means that the sun must be out) then it means six more weeks of winter weather, but if it doesn't see its shadow (which means the sun must not be out) then spring weather will come in six weeks. That doesn't make any sense to me. If we want an early spring (and who doesn't) then we have to hope for a cloudy day today. On March 15, who will remember the weather on February 2? We will! Because this year, we are going to pay attention! Did you know that Groundhog Day and the Super Bowl have several things in common?

First, no one remembers the results! Without looking it up, did the most famous groundhog (Punxsutawney Phil) see his shadow in 2008? See, I told you. Without looking it up, which team lost the Super Bowl in 2008? I told you.

Second, many pay attention. Do you know who will deliver the speech at this year's Groundhog Day (Eve) celebration on February 1 in Punxsutawney, Pennsylvania? No, it is not Bill Murray (Star of the movie Groundhog Day), it will be the governor of Pennsylvania, Tom Corbett (his wife will be there too). In 2008, the rodent did see his shadow and the largest crowd ever - thousands (maybe tens of thousands) were there to see it at dawn on a 29 degree morning! Do you know how many people watched the Super Bowl in 2008? 97.5 million people watched the New York Giants defeat the New England Patriots 17-14.

So, have a great time watching the groundhog and have fun watching the Super Bowl, but please plan to attend Sunday School and church on Sunday.


