Recently, I read a story about an eighty-two year old man's reflections upon his life as he lay dying. He said, "If I had my life to live over, I would try to make more mistakes." One of the things we often regret as we get older is the failure to take more risks. Sometimes the safest path isn't always the best one. Hebrews 11:6 says "God blesses faith."

The dying man said, "If I had my life to live over, I would relax more — I would limber up." I attended a timeshare sales getaway weekend with my wife once when the sales person said, "One thing Americans fail to do enough is to go on vacation and relax." Although I knew he was trying to sell me something, I also knew he was right. We all need to vacation and relax more.

The dying man also said, "If I had my life to live over I know of very few things that I would take seriously." While it is certainly possible to be too foolhardy, more often than not we tend to ere too much on the serious side. When is the last time you had a good belly laugh - even over silliness? Sometimes we need to forget about what others may think (while still honoring God) and just have fun!

He added, "If I had my life to live over I would take more trips." When my grandparents were in their seventies, they decided to take a trip out West. They traveled from North Alabama through Texas to California and back through Nebraska in a big loop...in a week's time! They took a video camera. All we saw on the film were telephone poles in a blur! But they had a great time! They talked about their trip to California for the rest of their lives.

He said, "If I had my life to live over I would eat more ice cream and fewer beans." I know our bodies are the temple of the Holy Spirit, but isn't fiber keeping many of us from the Pearly Gates?

The dying man's final reflection was his most poignant. He said, "If I had my life to live over I would have more actual troubles and fewer imaginary ones." Many of us waste far too much of our time worrying. Ironically, worry only hastens the demise that we dread. Worry peals away time that can never be regained.
