Tim Hansel wrote in his book, *Holy Sweat*, "In 1962, Victor and Mildred Goertzel published a revealing study of 413 "famous and exceptionally gifted people" called *Cradles of Eminence*. They spent years attempting to understand what produced such greatness, what common thread might run through all of these outstanding people's lives. Surprisingly, the most outstanding fact was that virtually all of them, 392 had to overcome very difficult obstacles in order to become who they were."

No one asks for hard times in their lives; but as Christians, we can find purpose in them. The verse that has ministered to me the most over the years (in difficult times) is Romans 8:28 – "And we know that all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are the called according to His purpose." Challenges may surprise us, but they never surprise God. God uses the hard times in our lives to teach us that we are ultimately dependent upon Him for all of our needs. When hard times come your way, instead of fearing them or dreading them, why not embrace them in the truth of Romans 8:28? What can God teach us through our next trial? What good will come as a result of it?

I pray that God would protect us from trials; but should He allow us to encounter them, may we do so with a sense of excitement of what He has to teach us in them.

One truth that I have learned is that God is faithful in the sunshine and in the storms.


