#### From Our Pastor

William "Bull" Nelson was a general in the Union Army during the Civil War. Prior to his service in the Union Army, Nelson served for twenty-one years in the United States Navy. He was always a busy man and never made trust in Christ a priority for his life. At 6'-4" and 300 pounds, he was an unusually big man for his time. Although, he was kind and patient in social situations, he was uncompromising when it came to duty. Two days after his thirtyeighth birthday in 1862, he was shot and killed, not by a Confederate enemy, but by fellow Union General Jefferson C. Davis. It seems that while chastising General Davis for what General Nelson considered to be lazy indifference. Nelson slapped Davis, publically humiliating him. General Davis responded by shooting General Nelson in the chest. Knowing his wound was mortal, General Nelson requested that someone go and find a chaplain and bring him to him. In the confusion and shock of his last minutes on earth, all that mattered to General Nelson was Jesus Christ. He died within thirty minutes of his wound and no chaplain made it to him in time.

In just the past three weeks, I have lost three friends or acquaintances to unexpected and sudden death. Two of them were in their fifties. All three were men, all three had loving families, and all three were believers on the name of Jesus. They left behind grieving families and friends; but with the hope of seeing their loved ones again in Christ. Sometimes death is expected, such as in the case of a long illness; but at other times death comes suddenly and unexpected like a thief in the night. Death as a result of a long illness, as tragic as it is, provides time – sweet time – to prepare. Sudden, unexpected death does not afford the blessing of time.

In light of these recent tragic and sudden losses, I have been reminded and convicted to remind you to plan for death. Of course, there are things like insurance, wills and other important papers to remember, but our greatest priority in planning for death is to be certain of a personal faith relationship with Jesus Christ as the Savior and Lord of our lives - and to know that our family and friends have the blessing of this relationship with Christ as well.

Please make Jesus Christ the priority of your life; there may not be time to do it later.
