From Our Pastor

I came across this story the other day. God spoke to me through it; I thought you might enjoy it too. "Three times a month, Jermaine Washington and Michelle Stevens get together for what they call a "gratitude lunch." With good reason! Washington donated a kidney to Stevens, whom he described as "just a friend." They met at work where they used to have lunch together. One day Michelle wept as she spoke about waiting on a kidney donor list for 11 months. She was being sustained by kidney dialysis, but suffered chronic fatigue and blackouts and was plagued by joint pain. Because Washington couldn't stand the thought of watching his friend die, he gave her one of his kidneys. When you've got something great to be thankful for, having a "gratitude lunch" is a great way to celebrate." (*Today in the Word*, November 14, 1993).

That is such a simple story of thanksgiving. The Lord's Supper is a story of thanksgiving too. It is a reminder of how God's matchless grace met our greatest need. Following the worship service this Sunday, we too will have a "gratitude lunch." We call it a "fellowship meal." This is something we do three times each year (we don't have a fellowship meal in the summer). The purpose of the Lord's Supper is to remember what Christ has accomplished for us on the cross and through the empty tomb -areflection that always leads to thanksgiving in the life of a believer. The purpose of the Lord Supper and fellowship meal follows the teaching of our Lord. Jesus said, "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another; as I have loved you, that you also love one another. ³⁵By this all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another" (John 13:34-35). In our worship service, we express our love to the Lord. In our fellowship meal, we express our love to one another.

In addition to our tradition, this Sunday (following our fellowship meal) we will enjoy a concert in the sanctuary by the Gap Creek Singers (of which some of our church members are a part). It is going to be a great day. I pray you will make plans to join us in worship and fellowship.
