According to *The Barnhart Concise Dictionary of Etymology*, "Advent" is an old English dating back to 963 A.D.; it comes from the Latin word, *adventus. Adventus* comes from the Latin root, *advenire*: "Ad" means "to" and "venire" means "come." The early usage of "Advent" was clearly and without question Christian. It referred to the season before Christmas. By 1400, it was being used to refer to the Second Coming of Christ and by the 1700's it was secularized to refer to any important arrival. Today, we speak of the "advent" of the space age or the "advent" of the computer. Christians today make distinctions in our speech differentiating the first advent of Christ from the second.

The world has been stealing our words for centuries now; but to be fair, we have stolen a few of their words too! Easter was originally, *Eastre*. *Eastre* was the name of the Germanic goddess whose feast was celebrated at the spring equinox. *Eastre* ultimately comes from *East*, which originally referred to the goddess of dawn, corresponding to the Roman goddess, *Aurora* and the Greek goddess, *Eos*.


So, for the sake of peace in this season of Advent, let's agree to stop stealing the world's words so long as they stop trying to steal our Christmas!
