

# **Thoughts from Pastor Barry**

Spring is the season for new beginnings. Spring is the season for Easter. I pray you are planning even now to celebrate Easter with all of your heart, soul, strength and mind.



Max Lucado, in his book, Six Hours One Friday, tells the story of a missionary in Brazil who discovered a tribe of Indians in a remote part of the jungle. They lived near a large river – they called it "The River of Death." The tribe was in desperate need of medical attention. A contagious disease was ravaging the population; people were dying daily. A hospital was not too terribly far away – across the river, but the Indians would not cross it because they believed the river was inhabited by evil spirits. To enter that river would mean certain death.

The missionary explained how he had crossed the river and was unharmed, but the tribe was unimpressed. He then took them to the riverbank and placed his hand in the water, but they still would not go in. He even walked into the water to his waste and splashed around but it didn't matter. They were still too afraid to enter the water.

Finally, he dove into the water, swam beneath the surface and emerged on the other side. He raised a triumphant fist into the air! He had entered the river and escaped safely to the other side. It was then that the Indians cheered and followed him across. They followed him to the place where the healing was.

Isn't that what Jesus did? He entered the river of death and came out on the other side so that we might no longer fear death, but find eternal life in Him.

I encourage you to honestly ask yourself what fear(s) keep you from fully trusting in the risen Christ. Being a follower of Jesus Christ is not an intellectual "belief" about Jesus (James 2:19). A true Christian is a person who has put faith and trust in the person and work of Jesus Christ, including His death on the cross as payment for sins and His resurrection on the third day to give new life. John 1:12 - "But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, to those who believe in His name." The mark of a true Christian is love for others and obedience to God's Word. A true Christian is a born-again child of God, a part of God's family, and one who has been given new life in Jesus Christ. 2 Corinthians 5:17 - "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new."

Know these four truths: there is a God; He loves you unconditionally; He is in control of all things all the time; He can only be known through a personal relationship with His Son and our Savior, Jesus Christ. "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding" (Proverbs 3:5).
