


OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD

Thoughts from Pastor Barry

On August 14, 1945, Japan surrendered unconditionally to the allies effectively ending World War II. A cease-fire was formally ordered and announced for Tuesday morning at 7:00 on August 15, 1945. Edward O'Dell Mullins, Jr. was assigned to Able Company, 1st Battalion, 128 Infantry Regiment of the 32nd Division of the United States Sixth Army as a replacement soldier in May 1945. Private



Mullins was involved in a couple of firefights in July 1945. In fact, he was awarded the Bronze Star in July.

At 6:15 on the morning on August 14, 1945, PFC Mullins was on patrol in the Philippines when he was shot and killed by a Japanese sniper. That event made Private Mullins the last American to be killed in combat during WWII. Throughout the years, the unenviable story of Private Mullins has drawn much interest. Now, seventy years later, I would like to share the rest of the story with you. On the other side of the world on that fateful August day, Private Mullins' only son, Jim, had just celebrated his second birthday.

Jim grew up without a father; but there was more. When Jim's uncle died, he became the sole survivor in his family with the Mullins' name. When Jim tried to enlist to serve in the Vietnam War, he was denied based upon the military's Sole Survivor policy. Jim eventually married and had three daughters. Jim knows that one day his family's name will go to the grave with him.

War, as with any sin, creates heartaches that go far beyond what we can see, hear, touch, taste or smell. There is only one solution to sin. His name is Jesus Christ and He came to be our Savior. Through Him, we are adopted into the family of God. "But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, to those who believe in His name: who were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God" (John 1:12-13). In Christ, we are adopted into a family whose name shall never end! It is comforting to know that we can have a life that transcends the limitations of this world.

As we wrap up our summer vacations and prepare for a new church year, let's remember that we have been commissioned to take this Good News of the Gospel of Christ to the ends of the earth. There is no more important news that we can share than the eternal hope of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Tragic stories like the Mullins' story will continue in the world, but we have good news - there is hope in Jesus Christ! "These things I have spoken to you, that in Me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation; but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world" (John 16:33).
