

Thoughts from Pastor Barry

Can you believe it is 2016? Let's take a moment and reflect upon where we have been and where we are going. We have been emphasizing our need to reach people with the gospel of Jesus Christ and that is what we will continue to do! Christ is our hope - our only hope! We are not



responsible for what people do with the gospel, but we are responsible to deliver it. We are responsible to communicate the unspeakable blessings of receiving Christ and the horrendous consequences of rejecting Him.

The story of the steamboat, Robert E. Lee, illustrates our responsibility well. The Robert E. Lee was built in New Albany, Indiana in 1866. It was nicknamed, "The Monarch of the Mississippi". The Robert E. Lee holds the record for the fastest time traveled on the Mississippi River between New Orleans and St. Louis for a commercial ship. It once won a famous race against the most famous of all steamships, Natchez VII, in June, 1870.

Tragedy struck at 3:30 a.m. on September 30, 1882, when the Robert E. Lee steamed south out of Vicksburg and caught fire about thirty miles north of New Orleans. Twentyone people aboard lost their lives that morning. The Captain discovered the fire and ordered the first mate to wake the crew and run through the ship alerting every one of the danger. Hundreds were on board that day and their response to the warnings is chilling. Some became angry that they had been awakened so early - they had been inconvenienced. Some thought a drunkard or a practical joker was just having fun they were amused. Some heard the warning but were not sure if it was true and perished while waiting to substantiate the story – they were skeptical. And there were some that heard the warning made their way to safety – they believed.

That story has been told by preachers since that fateful September morning because it illustrates so well the plight of the world. Some become angry when confronted with the truth of the gospel. Some are amused and find the gospel to be interesting and entertaining. Some are skeptical and decide to wait until they can substantiate the facts. However, there are always some who hear the gospel, heed its warning, and escape the fire of Hell.

We do not know how people will respond to the gospel, but we can be certain that we have a responsibility to share the good news of salvation in Jesus Christ. As we enter a new year, the main thing must remain the main thing! Whatever else we might do, we must proclaim the good news of the gospel of Jesus Christ!!

On February 7, we will begin a seven week series entitled "Every Believer a Witness" during the Sunday morning worship hour that will equip all of us to share the gospel of Jesus Christ with others. Please be in prayer about this effort to strengthen our commitment to the gospel. You will be hearing much more about this exciting opportunity in the coming weeks.
