### **Thoughts from Pastor Barry**

Beginning February 7, we will begin a seven week study entitled "Every Believer a Witness". The study is written by Dennis Nunn and is a very practical, natural and easy way for us to develop a culture of evangelism in our lives, families, church and community. We are living in increasingly dark times; people desperately need the light of the gospel of Jesus Christ. As followers of Jesus Christ, we are stewards of that light.



In the nineteenth century, lighthouses on U.S. coasts were tended by lighthouse keepers and their families. If a man who tended the light became disabled, often the work fell to his wife or children to continue to manage the lighthouse. Such was the case of Hosea Lewis. In 1853, Hosea Lewis became the keeper of the lighthouse on Lime Rock Island at Newport, Rhode Island. Shortly after, Mr. Lewis suffered a stroke which rendered him unable to tend to the light.

At that time, his teenage daughter, Ida, assumed the responsibility for the light. Each day, she cleaned the reflectors, trimmed the wick and filled the oil reservoir at sunset and midnight in addition to providing for her father's care. She also took responsibility for the education of her siblings. Whatever the weather, every school day she loaded her siblings in a boat and rowed them 500 yards to the mainland, returned to the lighthouse, and then rowed back in the afternoon to bring them home. In the mid-nineteenth century at a time when it was unusual to see a woman maneuvering a boat, Ida became well-known for her boating skills.

Her fame increased when at the age of sixteen she rescued four young men from the water when their boat capsized. On March 29, 1869, Ida saved two drowning servicemen from nearby Fort Adams. Public knowledge of Ida's courage spread as far as Washington D.C., which led to meetings with President Grant, Vice-President Colfax, General William Tecumseh Sherman and Admiral George Dewey. In 1879, Ambrose Everett Burnside (legendary Civil War General, Governor of Rhode Island and U.S. Senator) appointed Ida to be the official lighthouse keeper for Lime Rock Island. At that time, she was the highest paid lighthouse keeper in the United States earning an annual salary of \$750. On July 16, 1881, she was awarded the Gold Lifesaving Medal from the United States Government for her heroic rescue of two more soldiers from Fort Adams.

Ida was officially credited with saving eighteen lives, but unofficial reports say the number was closer to forty. Because of her reputation for saving lives, she became the subject of articles in *Harpers Weekly*, *The New York Tribune*, *Leslie's Magazine* and many other publications. Thousands of people (many very famous) visited with her at the lighthouse during her lifetime. She drew the attention of the Women's Suffrage Movement as an example of the inherent strength of women. She received too many awards, cash, gold and pensions to list in this article! At least three pieces of music were inspired by her including "Lighthouse Keeper" by Neptune's Car!

Her last rescue came when she was sixty-three. She saved the life of a friend who had fallen into the water on her way to visit Ida. When asked where she found her strength and courage, she answered, "I don't know, I ain't particularly that strong. The Lord Almighty gives it to me when I need it, that's all."

Ida Lewis was a faithful steward of the light; but the reason she was so faithful is that she realized there were always people that would need to be saved.

There are many people all around us that need to be saved; we can become a part of their salvation by learning how to become effective stewards of the gospel of Jesus Christ. I look forward to our journey together through "Every Believer a Witness" beginning February 7.
