Thoughts from Pastor Barry

I consider myself to be a somewhat private person, but I have decided to go public with a relatively new discipline in my life. In June 2016 I decided that I needed to lose some weight. I began my journey on the first day of July. I know that many of us make this decision and follow up with some kind of attempt to lose weight, but it isn't just weight loss that I am hoping to



accomplish. There is more at stake. For me, this is as much of a spiritual discipline as it is a physical or mental discipline. I do not call my plan a strategy or a diet; rather, it is a conviction.

I have always had a burden for world hunger. When I give thanks for my food, I am usually painfully aware that hunger is a reality for many in the world. When I began an internet search of nations where most calories were consumed on a daily basis, as you might expect, I found that the United States was at the top of the list averaging around 3,700 calories per person per day. I then began searching for the nations that consumed the fewest calories per person per day. I found that nations in Asia and Africa were the most mal-nourished people on earth. One nation, Eritrea, caught my attention. Adult males in that little Northeast African nation consume fewer than 1,600 calories per day. As I reflected upon how God has blessed me with abundance, my heart broke for those trapped in what must seem to be endless hunger. Although Eritrea is divided about equally between Christians and Muslims, persecution against Christians is extreme.

Two of my passions in life come together in one little lawless, hungry nation – hunger and persecution. So, I have committed to pray for the persecuted church in Eritrea and for the hungry. In a feeble attempt to empathize, I have set a daily calorie intake limit to 1,560 calories per day for myself. Rarely do I go to bed hungry, but when I do, I remember to pray for the people of Eritrea. While they have little to eat, I have plenty. I can make a sandwich or even visit the local 24 hour restaurant if I wish; they can't. I have a host of options; they have none.

Christians in Eritrea suffer unimaginable horrors. In an attempt to escape persecution, they flee to Egypt with the hope of reaching Israel. Few arrive alive. In Egypt, they are targeted by human traffickers and by the Egyptian government itself. To get to Egypt, they must pass through Sudan. Sudan is 90% Muslim and persecution against Christians is fierce. Conversion from Islam to Christianity is punishable by death in Sudan.

World Hunger Day is October 9. Global Hunger Relief (GHR) was formerly known as the World Hunger Fund. GHR is one of the most efficient ways to give to eliminate world hunger. Since administrative costs are covered through the Southern Baptist Cooperative Program, 100% of our gifts go directly to feed hungry people. About 800 million people are underfed in the world today. Forty-five percent of the deaths of children under the age of five are related to poor nutrition. Please give whatever you might spend on a nice restaurant dinner to Global Hunger Relief so the hungry can eat. The Day of Prayer for the Persecuted Church is November 6. Please commit to pray for the persecuted church. Be a good steward of the Free Church and invite people into your home, your Sunday School class, or one of our monthly church-wide prayer meetings and pray fervently for the persecuted church.
