Thoughts from Pastor Barry

We are in the "dead of winter." Have you ever thought about the meaning or the origin of that particular idiom? According to the British website, Bloomsbury-International.com, the phrase references a very specific time of year:

[T]he time of year when it is coldest and darkest and the days are the shortest. If something or someone is "dead," then they are lifeless, silent and completely still...[T]he phrase "In the dead of winter" means in the middle of the coldest season, much as "in the dead of the night" means in the middle of the quiet, dark night.

For many of us, winter is a cold, dark and lonely time; but winter is necessary. It is an important season in God's creation. If there were no winter – if there were no death – it would be difficult to appreciate spring, to appreciate life.

Winter is necessary. It is a passage.

The four seasons reflect the seasons of life. Spring is the season of renewal, of birth. Summer is the season of life. Autumn is the season of dying. Winter is the season of death. All four are important, necessary, and certain. We must pass through winter to get to spring. The only path from autumn to spring passes through winter. While no one looks forward to dying and death with great anticipation and joy, we can look forward to these seasons of life with hope.

Winter has many benefits. Winter brings the death of annoying insects and also annual plants. Common wheat is an annual plant. Jesus gave an insightful illustration using this plant:

But Jesus answered them, saying, "The hour has come that the Son of Man should be glorified. Most assuredly, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the ground and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it produces much grain (John 12:23-24, NKJV).

Without death there is no life. We see this in nature. We also see it in the Word of God: "And He began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer many things, and be rejected by the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again" (Mark 8:31, NKJV). Without Crucifixion Friday, there would be no Resurrection Sunday!

Some of us are facing trials – seasons of pain in our lives. With the hope that comes only through a personal relationship with God through His only Son, Jesus, we can embrace the cold, dark and lonely trials of life:

My brethren, count it all joy when you fall into various trials, knowing that the testing of your faith produces patience. But let patience have its perfect work, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking nothing" (James 1:2-4, NKJV).

It's February but hang on, April is coming! It may be hard now, but as the Psalmist wrote: "For His anger is but for a moment, His favor is for life; Weeping may endure for a night, But joy comes in the morning" (Psalm 30:5, NKJV).
