Thoughts from Baxter McGuirt

We get to see the importance of missions among Baptists highlighted in things like the Lottie Moon offering at Christmas, and through ministries like WMU. But Baptists haven't always been devoted to missions, and the story of how God began to change that is inspiring.

In 1787 William Carey, only 26 years old, stood up in a meeting of Baptist pastors in England and posed the question whether or not they should begin to fund and send out missionaries. He was told by an older minister, John Collet Ryland, "Young man, sit down; when God pleases to convert the heathen, he will do it without your aid and mine." It would take six more years before Carey could raise enough support to leave for India, the first British Baptist missionary. He would become known as the father of modern missions.

But God had already raised up the most unlikely Americans and put them on the mission field. George Liele was the first: a former African American slave, freed by his master to preach among slaves. After the Revolutionary War he booked passage to Jamaica, and there he preached the gospel among the slaves on the island, making converts, planting a church, and becoming the first Baptist missionary born in America.

One of Liele's first converts, Andrew Bryan, remained in Savannah as pastor of the First African Baptist Church, which grew to over 700 members. Another of Liele's disciples, David George, left Savannah in 1782 to plant a church in Nova Scotia, Canada; ten years later George would move to Sierra Leone and plant one of the first Baptist churches in Africa. By the time William Carey left England for India, God was already accomplishing what Liele called a "great work" through him and his friends. God used Liele, an uneducated slave that his homeland counted as three-fifths of a person, to convert thousands to faith in Christ.

We are never too weak or too lowly to be used by God. Liele, Bryan, and George - slaves all - are just one illustration of the truth Paul saw in the cross of Christ: "God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong; God chose what is low and despised in the world, even things that are not, to bring to nothing things that are, so that no human being might boast in the presence of God." 1 Cor. 1:27-29

That truth means that all of us, no matter our condition, can carry out William Carey's great statement on missions: "Expect great things from God. Attempt great things for God."
