### **Thoughts from Baxter McGuirt**

**Spring is a time of busyness.** Houses get cleaned. Gardens go in. Exams loom. We look forward to warmer weather and greener pastures. But Spring begins in March with ground left cold and barren by the Winter we struggle to leave behind. Our hearts are no different – we long for new growth and revived hearts, yet God's first answer to prayer for revival is nearly always to show us our sin. Longing to grow, we find that our hearts are stubbornly cold and stony.

We can give up, turn away from Jesus, and remain just as we are. Faced with our sinful hearts and our lack of faith we may make a half-hearted effort to improve, but then quickly give up. We may go through the motions, may keep up appearances, but underneath we're unchanged, unrepentant. Jesus denounced those who did the same in his day, those who, hearing his call, refused to draw near to him. Take a look at how he addresses this attitude in cities like Chorazin and Bethsaida in Matthew 11:20-24.

Or we can try to fix ourselves. Confronted with our problems we try to solve them with our own wisdom and strength. We embark on a religious self-improvement regimen. It can look good on the outside, but it leaves us exhausted, bitter, and no better off. This was the life of the Pharisees, who were furious at the hungry disciples of Jesus one afternoon for nothing more than plucking a few heads of grain as a snack on a Sabbath day. (Mt. 12:1-8)

Sandwiched between these stories in Matthew, Jesus shows us a better way. Jesus prays, "I thank you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, that you have hidden these things from the wise and understanding and revealed them to little children." (Mt. 11:25-26). Between the unrepentant cities and the unrepentant Pharisees, Jesus was exhausted. Maybe that afternoon as he trudged toward another town filled with disbelief and unrepentance, some children passed by. They ran through the fields with the simple joy of childhood. They lifted his spirits. He turned and saw his exhausted followers, who were trudging along as well, beaten down by debates with the Pharisees and the hard hearts in the cities. He didn't call them to harder labor or to greater effort, but encouraged them with the longing of their hearts. "Come to me all who are weary and heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls."

This is the way of Jesus, open to every tired and burdened soul. Not the doomed ignorance of Chorazin and Bethsaida. Not the cold, stern "wisdom" of the elder leaders in Jerusalem, or the tiresome demands of the Pharisees dogging their heels. Jesus offers us a better way. Trapped between those who demand we do better and our stubborn inability to change, Jesus says to us, "Come." Faced with our cold and stony hearts, and lacking the strength to change them, Jesus offers to pull with us: "Take my yoke." Battered by the holy but impossible demands of the religious, Jesus proclaims to us: "I am gentle and lowly in heart." Exhausted by our sin and our futile attempts to conquer it, Jesus coaxes us to a place at his feet and whispers, "You will find rest for your souls."

Don't give up. Don't go it alone. Come find rest in Jesus.


