Thoughts from our Pastor

On the subject of vision, Lynn Anderson once wrote:

About 350 years ago a shipload of travelers landed on the northeast coast of America. The first year they established a town site. The next year they elected a town government. The third year the town government planned to build a road five miles westward into the wilderness. In the fourth year the people tried to impeach their town government because they thought it was a waste of public funds to build a road five miles westward into a wilderness. Who needed to go there anyway? Here were people who had the vision to see three thousand miles across an ocean and overcome great hardships to get there. But in just a few years they were not able to see even five miles out of town. They had lost their pioneering vision. With a clear vision of what we can become in Christ, no ocean of difficulty is too great. Without it, we rarely move beyond our current boundaries.

In How to Find Your Church, George Barna wrote:

Vision is the ability to understand the history, the present condition, and the potential of the church, and to conceive a plan for action that will maximize the ministry potential. More often than not, vision is the result of having spent much time absorbing the facts about the community, knowing the resources upon which the church can call (people, funding, facilities, equipment, etc.) and devising sound but creative strategies for moving forward. Vision always entails progress: it is never satisfied with the status quo.

We can never be satisfied with the status quo. Northgate must allow God to reach her community through us and growth in Christ requires faith: "But without faith it is impossible to please Him, for he who comes to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him" (Hebrews 11:6, NKJV).

Seven decades ago, when God gave men and women at Northgate Baptist Church a vision for her community, they could not have imagined the North Main community in 2019. But God could and He did; and now He calls Northgate to envision His work in the North Main community seventy years into the future. God will reach Northgate's community through us when we submit ourselves to His will for His purposes.

God's will is for men, women, boys and girls to come to faith in Jesus Christ. So we live by faith, we plan by faith and we succeed by faith.

I am excited about the future. Are you?

You see, almost every Sunday they would host all of the college students at their home for Sunday lunch. Mrs. Banyai would pull out all the stops too. She is a phenomenal cook and put a ton of time and effort into cooking for us. Just thinking about her pork chops is getting me hungry right now! The craziest part about this is that they would do this every Sunday that they were able... and it meant the world to us. You see, as a Student Minister, I see many young people who haven't had a good experience with Jesus' church. I have seen many adults who would rather complain about and talk down to the vounger generation rather than love them "in deed and truth" (1 John 3:18) the way the Banyai's did. You see, Bruce and Lois were never the coolest or trendiest couple, but we couldn't care less. They loved us. They spent time with us, they sacrificed for us, and they cared for us. Love crosses any generation gap. In my short time back at Northgate, I have been so impressed with some of the Bruce and Lois Banyai's that I've met. Over the course of several youth events we have had many of our members with no youth in the youth group step up and make all sorts of desserts and food for our students. Your service to your church and to our student ministry is more impactful than you know! I praise God for those of you that take the time to sacrifice for, serve, and love our young people!
