# **Thoughts from our Pastor**

I read a story recently about a son that had a conversation with his father. The son asked, "Dad, if three frogs were sitting on a limb out over a pond and one of them decided to jump, how many frogs would be left on the limb?" The father answered, "Two." The son said, "No, Dad, that's not the right answer." The father answered again and said, "Oh, I get it, if one frog jumps, then the other two will follow, so the answer is zero." The son responded, "No, Dad, that's not the correct answer either." The father said, "Well, I give up. How many frogs would be left on the limb?" The son answered, "Three!" The father said, "That's not possible, you said one of them jumped off the limb." The son said, "No I didn't; I said one of the frogs *decided* to jump, I didn't say it jumped."

That humorous story sounds a little like New Year's resolutions. At the beginning of a new year, we often make great and ambitious resolutions only to find out months later that we are like those frogs – still sitting on the limb! Resolutions are like plans: They are valuable only if we follow through with action. I've made many resolutions only to look, see that it's June, and realize I never followed through on my decision, commitment or resolution – still sitting on that limb!

Let's allow **God** to establish our resolutions, and then let's act on them. I read through the Old Testament book of Nehemiah in December. There are many great lessons to be learned from Nehemiah. In chapter two, the people decided to rebuild the wall around Jerusalem, and they followed their decision with action:

So they said, "Let us rise up and build. Then they set their hands to this good work." (Nehemiah 2:18)

And when adversity and conflict came, they stayed the course:

Those who built on the wall, and those who carried burdens, loaded themselves so that with one hand they worked at construction, and with the other held a weapon. (Nehemiah 4:17)

There is much to learn from the Book of Nehemiah. Don't just plan, act!! And when trouble and distraction come, stay the course!!

Many people make lofty resolutions in January like reading through the Bible only to drop out when they encounter the difficult books of the Law. Read the Bible. Read it from Genesis to Revelation. Adopt a daily reading goal and stay the course. You will be glad you did.

#### YOUTH MINISTRY WITH SUBSTANCE from Barry Agnew, Jr., Minister of Students and Education

Have you ever volunteered in Youth Ministry at a church? If so you probably have some stories to tell. I know I certainly do. Working with students can be fun, tiring, humorous, sad, entertaining, and everything in between. It is an emotional rollercoaster. In all the craziness though we have to ask, what's the point? When it's all said and done, what is the ultimate point of the youth ministry?

During my freshman year of college there was another student who lived across the hall from me who was planning to go on to medical school and become a surgeon. One day out of curiosity I asked why he wanted to become a surgeon. He said, "well my dad is a surgeon and he makes pretty good money." I didn't really know what to say but all I could think was, "really, that's it?" I figured that surely he had some passion to help people and possibly even save lives, but no, at the end of the day he just thought it would be a decent living. So guess what ended up happening to this young man? A few years after graduating college I learned that he didn't in fact become a surgeon. Right before starting medical school he backed out. Evidently, he just didn't want to put in the work to get though medical school to go into a vocation that he ultimately didn't care that much about.

At its core, youth ministry is no different than adult ministry. The purpose of youth ministry is to make faithful disciples of students. So we have to ask what is the purpose of our youth ministry here at Northgate. Much like the young man in the story above a youth ministry with no purpose will be a youth ministry with no fruit. Like many churches we have lots of activities at Northgate. Many of these activities promise a great time filled with plenty of laughter and memory making. Yet at its core we still have to ask if we are making disciples. So I ask you to pray for our students, pray for our student ministry, pray for our parents, and pray for me. Pray that we would make faithful disciples in our youth ministry. **Pray that we would be a youth ministry with substance**.

## A New Year, and a New Song
