Thoughts from our Pastor

"Though I speak with the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I have become sounding brass or a clanging cymbal. ²And though I have the gift of prophecy, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and though I have all faith, so that I could remove mountains, but have not love, I am nothing. ³And though I bestow all my goods to feed the poor, and though I give my body to be burned, but have not love, it profits me nothing.

⁴Love suffers long and is kind; love does not envy; love does not parade itself, is not puffed up; ⁵does not behave rudely, does not seek its own, is not provoked, thinks no evil; ⁶does not rejoice in iniquity, but rejoices in the truth; ⁷bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.

⁸Love never fails. But whether there are prophecies, they will fail; whether there are tongues, they will cease; whether there is knowledge, it will vanish away. ⁹For we know in part and we prophesy in part. ¹⁰But when that which is perfect has come, then that which is in part will be done away. ¹¹When I was a child, I spoke as a child, I understood as a child, I thought as a child; but when I became a man, I put away childish things. ¹²For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then face to face. Now I know in part, but then I shall know just as I also am known.

¹³And now abide faith, hope, love, these three; but the greatest of these is love." – 1 Corinthians 13:1-13

That beautiful chapter is often used to define the idea of love. Isn't it beautiful how the chapter begins with foundation? Love is necessary and indispensable for the Christian life. We cannot achieve any Christian virtue without love! However, as Paul concluded this chapter, he ended with mystery:

Now I know in part, but then I shall know just as I am also known. And now abide faith, hope, love, these three; but the greatest of these is love.

There are many things we do not understand in life. There are often more questions than answers, but Paul gave some solid life advice in 1 Corinthians 13. If what we do or how we respond is not founded in love, we should reconsider our actions. And then, as we are reminded by Paul, when we do not have all of the answers to life's challenges, remember: faith, hope and love. Especially love.

Many years ago, Reverend James W. Moore wrote about a man named George, who was known as a peacemaker with a wonderful sense of humor. He was loved at church, respected at the hospital where he worked, and always kind and respectful to everyone he met. George fell ill with an incurable disease and was confined to the hospital, where he eventually died. While he was in the hospital, the hospital administrator visited with him, and they spoke as though they were life-long friends. A few minutes later, one of the janitors came to visit George. They, too, had a great visit.

When the janitor left, George's daughter said, "Dad, do you realize that you treated the president of the hospital the same way you treated the janitor?" George called his family near to him and showed them a cross and a marble that he always kept in his pocket. He said, "The cross reminds me how much God loves me and the marble reminds me to treat others like I would want to be treated."

We have become familiar with the slogan: "Just do it." God would have us to become familiar with the truth: "Just love."

Northgate on Mission


