



Thoughts from our Pastor

The Covid-19 pandemic has certainly made an impact upon the world. Many cultural norms have been questioned, challenged and changed. And unless we are stuck in a burning barn, not many of us embrace change! Yet change has been thrust upon us. Just like that, the way we live has been changed. The way we work, the way we communicate, the way we worship – the way we live. Most of us get it: change is inevitable; I mean, the only constant thing in the world is change, right?

But sometimes sudden, life-altering changes like many of us are experiencing can be overwhelming. We have to be on guard for emotional and mental responses that might trigger anxiety, depression or any number of responses that might lead to greater concern.

Please allow me to offer a few tips that might lessen some of our concerns. For the purpose of not being repetitive, go to our website, www.northgatebaptist.com, and listen to the sermons I have preached since March 15, 2020. You will find two general messages there: Don't worry and don't waste opportunities for retrospection, introspection and innovative ways to make the most of these times. Biblically, I see four important perspectives through the lenses of Scriptures that can help us formulate a responsible response to the Covid-19 crisis. All are found in the thirteenth chapter of the following books of the Bible: Revelation, Leviticus, Romans and 1 Corinthians.

Revelation 13 – Covid-19 is not the end of the world. I do not see this healthcare, social and financial crisis as being an eschatological alarm. Historical perspective helps here. Things have been worse – much worse – and the world did not end. As much as 1/3 of the population in Europe perished as a result of the bubonic plague during the 14^{th} century, yet the world did not end. Two world wars ravaged the globe in the 20^{th} century, yet the world did not end. I don't believe the world is ending as a result of Covid-19.

Leviticus 13 – Covid-19 is leading all of us to close observation of our health and some of us to quarantine. Let's be mindful of our own health and the health of those around us during this time.

Romans 13 – Covid-19 has led our governing leaders to make some tough decisions to attempt to protect our society. Non-essential personnel should remain home to keep from spreading the virus. We should keep our gatherings to fewer than ten persons. That has hit us hard. March 15, 2020 was the last Sunday we enjoyed congregational worship. This decision was not intended to prohibit worship but to protect society. We have learned new and innovative ways to do ministry and worship because of Covid-19! I never thought live streaming would be the primary way we would worship!! Praise God for the technology of our time and the people willing and able to use it for the glory of God!

1 Corinthians 13 – It was this chapter that started the "13's" for me. Poetry evolving since the 17th century led to the well-known phrase: "Absence makes the heart grow fonder." Covid-19 has certainly led to a renewed appreciation for gatherings. I LOVE MY CHURCH FAMILY! I MISS MY CHURCH FAMILY! And I can't wait until we are back together! We will be separated at Easter, but our first Sunday back together will be our Easter celebration. I can't wait!

Until we are together again, please be patient, pray, take necessary precautions, stay in the Word and worship online. We are still a church family, we are just meeting and interacting in new ways. Let's make the best of our moment and let's be the best at doing it!!!
