## A Message from Dennis Page, Worship Leader

**THE PERFECT DAY TO WORSHIP**—If someone asks you the question, "How was your worship this week?", doesn't your mind automatically run back to Sunday? Perhaps it's time we rethink worship.

Keith Green, born in October 1953, was a musical genius. By the age of 11, he had written 40 original songs, and signed a five-year contract with Decca records, becoming the youngest person to ever sign with ASCAP.

In 1975 Keith and his wife, both from Jewish backgrounds, met Jesus as their Messiah. Keith's songs, and penetrating lyrics were to became a key fixture in the 1970's Jesus Movement. Tragically in 1982, Keith died in an airplane accident at the age of 28.

One of Keith's most powerful songs, "To Obey is Better Than Sacrifice" is based, of course, on those very words from 1 Samuel 15:22. Look at these lyrics:

"To obey is better than sacrifice,

I want more than Sunday and Wednesday nights Cause if you can't come to Me every day,

Then don't bother coming at all"

Pow! Read it again, this time aloud.

Author, A. W. Tozer puts it like this. "If you do not worship God seven days a week, you do not worship him on one day a week. There is no such thing known in heaven as Sunday worship unless it is accompanied by Monday worship and Tuesday worship and so on". Think about it!

"Come, Now is the Time to Worship" is a song we sometimes open our song service with. What do you say, we let those seven words be in our heart, every day? Indeed, every moment of every day.
