Thoughts from our Pastor

In church, summer means “busy,” and summer begins in June! As we begin to busy ourselves with summer plans, we need to be aware of the pitfalls this may bring.



The Greek philosopher, Heraclitus, wrote: “The only constant in life is change.” As much as many of us hate to admit, change is something we must manage. But change for the sake of change can be one of those pitfalls. Busyness is another potential pitfall. Though some of us feel comfortable being in the *business of busyness, doing so only for the sake of staying busy can be a lazy approach to life. And that’s a mistake.*

Summertime creates many opportunities for busyness, so we must be careful that we don’t fall into the trap of the business of busyness. Whether it is a church camp, a conference, or a vacation, we must always be aware of what God is doing around us. For example, we don’t have camp because that is what we do in the summer. We have camp to meet God through Christ or to grow deeper in our relationship with Him.

Sometimes we inadvertently reveal our attitudes by the language we use. Sometimes we use the word “must” when the word “can” is a better choice:

- It’s not that we must attend Sunday School. The blessing is we can.
- It’s not that we must read the Bible and pray. The blessing is we can.
- It’s not that we must attend corporate worship. The blessing is we can.

The difference between “must” and “can” is attitude.

There are many things we cannot choose in life, such as when and where we were born! But there are also many things we can choose in life, such as a positive, helpful and encouraging attitude. Whether we see the glass half empty or half full is often reflective of our attitude toward life. We have been redeemed by the shed blood of the Lord Jesus to be optimistic, not pessimistic.

It is difficult to engage the unsaved and unchurched with a pessimistic attitude. Further, Christians are not saved to be reactive toward our culture with the gospel but proactive. Christians in the Free Church are blessed with access. We have access to the gospel, access to the Bible, access to the church, access to corporate worship. We are blessed with access and plenty of it! Conversely, we must be disciplined to abstain from access to sin. Our freedom comes with a price. That price is responsibility. Being responsible stewards of our lives in the Lord is imperative.

If you're like me, you long to see God move, and not just in a small, ordinary ways, but in a powerful outpouring, so big that no one can deny it was anything but God. I picture it happening in Northgate's Sunday morning worship service as we're lifting our praises to Almighty God and seeking His presence. It's that longing to see Him move that compelled me to spend Saturday's prayer time in Northgate's sanctuary. It was a blessed time. I look forward to what God has in store for Northgate.
