

Thoughts from our Pastor

Snow? In January? In South Carolina? Surely not!!



ly? Of course, it snows in upstate South Carolina in January!! And weather forecasters are getting better and better at their job. Yet, we never really know, right? I mean, they've been wrong before. So, there is a feeling deep down inside us that says, "I'll believe it when I see it." Then, when the snow comes, we make our adjustments. Sometimes those adjustments come too late. Some of us will be better prepared than others.

Many life lessons can be learned from a winter storm. Lessons like preparedness, change and trust. If you visited the grocery store in the days prior to January's winter storm, you likely encountered bare shelves. Supply chain problems unrelated to the weather had already disrupted supplies in stores; the storm just made a bad situation worse. Circumstances (the storm in this case) can thrust rapid change upon us. Change usually involves loss. We grieve loss, but we don't always grieve change. For example, if I asked you if you liked change, you would likely answer, "No." But if I gave you a \$100 bill, you would welcome that change. The part of change that upsets us is loss. We grieve loss. Winter storms lead to icy roads, power outages and closed businesses, schools and churches. For many, that change is tolerable until things get out of our control, then things get bad fast!

So, what lessons can we learn from Winter Storm Izzy? We knew she was coming, but were we prepared? Did we have adequate groceries, heat sources and supplies to ride out the storm? Did we have a plan for an extended loss of electricity? Unpreparedness can lead to loss and loss leads to grief.

The Bible tells us that Jesus Christ will come again for His people. Are we ready? Will we be ready? In Matthew 24:44, Jesus said, "Therefore you also be ready. for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect." Are we prepared to meet Jesus at His Second Coming? Are we prepared for the moment of our physical death? You see, the greatest change in life is yet to come. Will our physical death lead to eternal life in Heaven or will it lead to the despair and grief of being separated from God?

We prepare through trust. We prepared for the winter storm because we trusted the forecasters. While the weather forecast may not always be accurate, God's Word is certain. The only way to prepare for the greatest change we will ever experience is through trust in God through His Son, Jesus Christ. Just as we can wait too late to prepare for a winter storm, we can wait too late to prepare for eternity. Sometimes change is thrust upon us quickly and there is no time to prepare. Unpreparedness for eternal life leads to eternal agony and grief. Today, we have time to prepare for eternity. Tomorrow may be too late.

Where Music and Ministry Meet

My Mom went to be with the Lord on November 7th, at the age of 92. She passed from death to life, but not before powerfully declaring the Gospel in both word and deeds.

About 10 years ago, I recorded an interview with my parents. In Mom's honor I'd like to share a few of the highlights. Mom committed her life to Jesus at the age of 6, at the First Baptist Church of Andrews, NC. As a little girl she dreamed of playing piano, but since that was during the depression, she had little hope her carpenter father could ever afford one. Yet one day, at the age of 12, coming home from school, she found a piano in her living room.

Mom only had 9 months of training before the teacher moved away, but through a lot of perseverance, practice, and pestering any musician who came to town, she learned to play and play well. It wasn't long before she was playing the pipe organ at the 10 o'clock Lutheran service, then running down a path in time to play for the 11 o'clock Baptist service. She would eventually serve as First Baptist of Hampton's organist for 25 years.

At the end, when she knew she was close to her Homegoing, we were gathered around her bed, and she asked us to sing "Jesus Loves Me" because Jack (her husband) knows that one. Then she asked us to sing, "There's Something About That Name." Even though her lips were barley moving, you could tell she was a singing with her heart "Jesus, Jesus, Jesus, there's just something about that name." It was a special time; you could sense God's presence. Two days later she was singing in His presence.
