A Message from Barry Agnew, Jr., Minister of Students and Education

Have you ever had trouble starting a fire? Maybe the wood was wet. Maybe your lighter wasn't working right. Maybe there was another reason but it's always annoying when you're trying to get a campfire going or maybe just a fire in your fireplace and things just aren't going right. On the other hand, it always amazes me how forest fires and house fires can start so easily on their own. It can be something so small. The tiniest spark or even something electronic getting too hot and just like that things can go up in flames.

As Christians, we talk a lot about revival. We hope and pray for revival. We even manufacture all sorts of strategies for revival. At the end of the day, however, we are powerless to bring about revival without a great move of God. While we make all sorts strategies and plans, God doesn't need any of that. God uses whatever He pleases and much like a fire starting on its own, when God starts a revival it can grow and spread beyond anything we could ever imagine.

During the month of July, we have a lot going on here at Northgate. The youth will be returning from camp, the children will be going to camp, and then VBS will be kicking off before we know it. It's easy to treat these activities like regular old church traditions, but remember, God can start a revival at a moment's notice through whatever avenue He pleases! Let's live and pray with the expectation that God is going to move. Let's approach these annual activities with the kind of faith that can move mountains. I promise that if we pray with a faith driven expectation we will see a movement of God that goes beyond anything that we could come up with ourselves!



A Message from Dennis Page, Worship Leader

Recently, our congregation sang the hymn, "The Church's One Foundation." It's such a rich, deep hymn, that if you ever wanted to do a theological study on "the Church", it might be a good place to start.

The background of how and why the song came to be written in 1860's South Africa is a fascinating story, but we won't delve into that now. Our hymnal contains only 3 of the hymn's original 6 verses but let's take a brief look at them.

Verse 1:

The Church's one foundation is Jesus Christ her Lord
She is His new creation by water and the Word
From heaven He came and sought her to be His holy bride
With His own blood He bought her and for her life He died.

Did you get that? Read those last 2 lines again. It's difficult for me to contemplate those lines without tears coming to my eyes.

Verse 2:

Elect from every nation, yet one o'er all the earth Her charter of salvation, One Lord, one faith, one birth One holy name she blesses, partakes one holy food And to one hope she presses, with every grace endued.

Did you notice in this verse the word "one" appears here 7 times? Unless you knew better, you might think the author believed there was only one fellowship, only one church. If so, you'd be right. I've known people who, if your beliefs didn't exactly match theirs, or if you didn't read the same version Bible they read, then you were less of a Christian or perhaps not a Christian at all. However, the truth of the matter is the church is larger and more inclusive than many might believe. Christian comedian Mark Lowrey who grew up in a Baptist Church, jokes that for many years he didn't know that Methodists could even be Christians. What really shook him up was when he met a Catholic Christian.

Verse 3 is a great way to wrap things up, because it's all about how God is going to wrap things up for the church. This verse teaches us that no matter how tough things get for us personally, or for the church as a whole, a glorious day is coming.

Verse 3:

'Mid toil and tribulation and tumult of her war She waits the consummation of peace forevermore Till with the vision glorious, Her longing eyes are blest And the great Church victorious, shall be the Church at rest.
