Thoughts from our Pastor

A new year brings new goals (resolutions). The beginning of a new year is a pragmatic way of doing things that we should have already been doing, right? It shouldn't take a specific date on a calendar to motivate us to begin doing what we know we should have already been doing; whether that is dieting, budgeting, exercising, praying, Bible study (we could all add to the list). Benjamin Franklin famously said, "Never put off to tomorrow the things that you can do today."



Of course, the reason we think of resolutions at the beginning of a new year is the simple fact that we've been reminded (by the calendar) that we haven't been doing the things that we know we should have already been doing. Is that sin? It sure sounds like it. It sounds a lot like what Paul wrote in Romans 7:19 (CEV) - "Instead of doing what I know is right, I do wrong." 

Anyone who has ever finished a long research paper on the night before it was due can identify with the above statement!

I want to encourage you to read the Bible. You may want to listen to it. Just get the Word of God into your life! Of course, we don't HAVE to wait until the beginning of a new year to begin reading the Bible, anytime we begin is a good time. For example, I finished the Bible on September 14, 2022 and began again on September 15. As stated above, a new year is a great time to begin new things. The Word of God is the source material for all we believe about our faith in Jesus Christ. Without reading the Bible ourselves, we are stunting our own growth. Hebrews 4:12 - "For the word of God is living and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing even to the division of soul and spirit, and of joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart."

Of course, that doesn't mean we don't need the ministries of the church or the fellowship of Christian community; the church is vital. She is the bride of Christ. The letters of the New Testament were written to and distributed to the church.
