Thoughts from our Pastor

We are only two weeks away from two of the greatest dates on the calendar: the beginning of Daylight Saving Time (Sunday, March 12) and the first day of spring (Monday, March 20)!!



I begin looking forward to these two dates every November. Who doesn't like more sunlight and warmer days? We also look forward to spring because it brings life. The death of winter is awakened by the new life of spring! Trees begin to blossom, flowers begin to bloom and that glorious pollen begins to float in the air! For those of you with allergies, spring would not be spring without pollen (be thankful in all things).

Spring means Easter. Easter will be April 9, this year. Please begin to make plans to worship with us at Northgate on Easter and bring a friend. According to several research websites, in 2021, between 30-35% of Americans said they attend worship services every week or nearly every week and an equal percentage of Americans said they never attend worship services. So, about 1/3 of Americans vote with their feet in saying that worship is valuable to them; therefore, simple math tells us that 2/3 of Americans seldom or never gather for corporate worship. Corporate worship has no intrinsic value to them. The inescapable truth is, we behave according to how we believe. If Jesus Christ and His church are important to us, we will find a way to worship Him with other believers. I saw a cartoon the other day that read: "If China can get a balloon to South Carolina, you can get to church!!" If Jesus Christ is important to us, then we will give financially to the work of the Lord through His church, serve the Lord with our time and gather regularly for corporate worship.

Spring also brings thoughts of romance. I read an article recently about hormones. Our bodies produce more melatonin in the winter and less in the spring. Melatonin has a lethargic affect on us that along with cold weather and less sunshine makes us want to sleep winter away. But spring leads our bodies to produce less melatonin and more serotonin. Serotonin along with more sunshine and warmer weather has a romantic effect upon us. Our mood is better and our energy is higher and we tend to be more receptive to new relationships. And like other aspects of God's creation, when we come out of our winter hibernation we are more likely to seek out new relationships. Isn't it interesting that God put Easter right in the middle of that season?

We want to spend time with the ones we love. Jesus Christ loves us and pursues a relationship with us. If we love Jesus, we will want to spend quality time with Him through His Word, in prayer and in worship with other believers. We want to spend time with those whom we love. Christians want to spend time with Christ and if we don't, there is something wrong with our relationship with Him.

The Big Little Word

Several years ago, I had the privilege of attending Moody Bible Institute. Early in the semester our theology professor, Dr. Dickenson, came to the blackboard and without saying a word, drew a horizontal line near the top of the blackboard, and labeled it "GOD." He then drew a horizontal line toward the bottom and labeled it "MAN." He then drew several vertical, pointed arrows from the bottom line toward the top line. He then spoke, saying that many people spend their whole their lives trying to reach all the way up to God. He then drew some shorter vertical lines up from the bottom to midway on the board, and then some lines from the top down to the board's midpoint, saying that many people who felt like they couldn't get all the way to the GOD, still felt that they could at least reach upwards, and God would somehow meet them halfway. Then without a word Dr. Dickenson erased all the vertical lines and said, "Understand this!" He then took his chalk and drew downward pointing arrows starting at the top "GOD" line, going all the way down to MAN.

Christianity sets itself apart from all the other world's religions in that the Bible teaches there's no way a person can be good enough or religious enough to meet God's standards. There's no work we can "do", including getting baptized or even taking communion, that can get us to God. You're probably thinking, "Let me get this straight, you say God has come all the way down to man, and yet you're saying I can't get to God, I don't get it!"

Well, I've got some great news! One tiny word solves the whole dilemma. That word is "LET." The old hymn "Let Jesus Come Into Your Heart" states it quite well. Here's the chorus: "Just now, your doubting's give o'er; Just now reject Him no more; Just now, throw open the door; Let Jesus come into your heart." For me, it was in my 9th floor dormitory room at Clemson when I heard Him knocking and I let Him in. It changed me forever. "Let", what a big little word!
