On the first day of class the professor gave us all an ungraded pre-test. I thought this was a little strange but it became very apparent that he knew exactly what he was doing. About 5 minutes into the test. I realized I was completely lost. I don't think I could answer a single question. After 15 minutes I got up, turned in the test, thanked the professor, and then informed him that I would be dropping the class. Within a few hours I had dropped the class, added a new class in its place, and was set to attend the first day of the new class the following day.

In the month of May, we will celebrate graduate recognition for our 2023 graduates. A Message from Dennis Page, Worship Leader

What did Jesus say? We were living in a small house in the western suburbs of Chicago. Our little boys were just three and four, but they were highly rambunctious and driving Peggy close to the edge. It had been one of those days, and in desperation Peggy points to a bedroom door and tells the boys "I'm going in there and ask Jesus what I should do." A few minutes later Peggy emerged from the room and found our four-year-old son staring at her wide-eyed, asking, "What did Jesus say?"

"What did Jesus say?" That's a great question. When it comes to prayer, we are often adept at making our petitions to God, telling him about all the things that are on our heart. However, when it comes to listening, to hearing from God, we may not fare too well. A.W. Tozer in his book, "The Pursuit of God" states "The tragedy is that our eternal welfare depends upon our hearing, and we have trained our ears not to hear." Part of that incongruity may lie in the kinds of petitions we make.

"Speak, O Lord" is a hymn we often sing that begins with an appropriate petition:

Speak, O Lord, as we come to you, To receive the food of Your Holy Word.

Take your truth, plant deep in us; Shape and fashion us, in your likeness.

That the light of Christ might be seen today In our acts of love and our deeds of faith. Speak, O Lord, and fulfill in us All Your purposes for Your glory.

In addition to the practice of proper petition, Tozer would also suggest a proper prayer posture. He says, "Get still to wait on God, and it's best that we get alone, preferably with our Bible outspread before us. Then if we will, we may draw near to God and begin to hear Him speak to us in our hearts".

So, as you practice proper petitioning, and proper prayer posture, the next time the question arises **"What did Jesus say?"** You may just know the answer.
