## **Thoughts from our Pastor**

On June 14, 1864, the same day that Union forces crossed the Potomac River in the state of Virginia to assault Confederate forces dug in at Petersburg, Virginia, a baby was born in Markbreit, Bavaria, in Germany. That baby's name was Alois Alzheimer. Alois Alzheimer earned the Doctor of Medicine degree with a specialization in Psychiatry. He was especially interested in



degree with a specialization in Psychiatry. He was especially interested in laboratory research of senile patients. This interest eventually led him to meet a woman named Auguste Deter. Mrs. Deter was a fifty-one-year-old with serious short-term memory problems. Mrs. Deter's family could not afford to keep her in the Fankfurt Asylum where she lived and was receiving treatment. Dr. Alzheimer came to an agreement with her family to pay for her expenses in exchange for the donation of her brain and medical records at the time of her death. Mrs. Deter died on April 8, 1906, and her medical records along with her brain were sent to the medical laboratory where Dr. Alzheimer was working. Dr. Alzheimer, along with his associates noted certain anomalies in her brain that later led Mrs. Deter to become the first person diagnosed with the dementia disease that we know as Alzheimer's.

Alzheimer's disease continues to plague many in our families causing much pain and grief. Alois Alzheimer's life and work causes us to pause and remember that every person conceived has great value and incredible God-given potential for good in this world.

No life is insignificant and every life is valuable and has wonderful potential. We never know when the next Alois Alzheimer will be born. Every life has a story, every life has value and every life has purpose. Every person is conceived on purpose and for a purpose. At the point of conception, that purpose is known only by God. The Bible teaches in Psalm 139:16 – "Your eyes saw my substance, being yet unformed. And in Your book they all were written, the days fashioned for me, when as yet there were none of them."

On May 17, 1749, a baby boy was born in Berkeley, Gloucestershire, England, named Edward Jenner. Edward was the eighth of nine children. His father was a pastor. Edward Jenner became a physician and later developed the world's first vaccine. He is most famous for developing a vaccine for small pox. Dr. Jenner is often credited with saving more lives than anyone in history.

On October 28, 1914, a baby boy was born in New York City, named Jonas Salk. Dr. Jonas Salk is credited with the "Miracle cure" for a polio vaccination. Dr. Salk did not seek a patent for his vaccine so that the medicine could be distributed to people as quickly as possible.

Has the person yet been conceived who will provide a cure for Alzheimer's disease or cancer? Only God knows. Through His Word, we know that every life is critically important from conception to natural death.

Take a stand for the sanctity of human life. Your life might one day depend upon it.

## A Message from Dennis Page, Worship Leader

Why do we engage in congregational worship? There may be several reasons you haven't considered. I have a 30year-old worship planner edition of "Songs for Praise and Worship". I often consult the offers "Ten Reasons for Congregational Worship". Today, let's look at the first five.

- 1. To glorify God and to enjoy Him "He who sacrifices thank offerings honors Me" (Psalm 50:23), "You will fill me with joy in Your presence, with eternal pleasures at Your right hand" (Psalm 16:11), "To Him Who sits on the throne and to the Lamb be praise and honor and glory and power, forever and ever!" (Revelation 5:13).
- 2. To help the people come into the presence of the Lord "Come before Him with joyful singing" (Psalm 100:2). Be careful not to think of worship as a song service; think of it as a progression into the manifest presence of God. Lives are changed in God's presence.
- **3. To stimulate the ministry of the Word of God** "While the harpist was playing, the hand of the Lord came up on Elisha" (2 Kings 3:15).
- 4. To help get the Word of God into our minds "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly as you sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs with gratitude in your hearts to God" (Colossians 3:16). Singing God's truth is an excellent way to memorize scripture. The worship time is, among other things, a teaching time.
- 5. To celebrate the finished work of Christ and our salvation history "To Him who loves us and has freed us from our sins by His blood ... to Him be the glory and power forever and ever" (Revelation 1:5,6). The song of Moses, found in Exodus 15, is a celebration of what God has done for his people. Psalm 136 is a review of Israel's history in praise.
