Thoughts from our Pastor



In August, 2023, my wife, Tina, and I visited our daughter, Laura, and her husband (Pierre) and his family in France. We visited the regions of Normandy, Brittany and Paris.

I am a bit of a nerd in my endeavors. I typically read exhaustively about every little thing that I might possibly expect to experience on a trip like the one to France. For instance, before our trip, I read several travel blogs on how to beat jet lag (with success). I tried (without success) to learn some basic French words. I worked hard not to be surprised, but of course I was.

Before I went, I already knew that France is the least evangelized nation in Europe. In preparation for any spiritual impact that I might have, I researched and located Baptist churches in the areas where we would be on the two Sundays that we were there. The first Sunday, August 27, we attended a Baptist church in Caen. The service was 1 ½ hours long and very good. We had a great time of worship. The second Sunday, September 3, we worshipped in a Baptist church in Paris (Bible Baptist Church). The service was two hours long and it was wonderful. We met many new friends in Christ.

I prepared to guard against pick-pocket thieves, which led me to read and discover that in the USA, there are 5 violent crimes for every 100,000 people. In France, there is 1 violent crime for every 100,000 people. I knew that, but I didn't "feel" it until I arrived. There are too many examples to give and too many stories to tell than space allows here. Suffice it to say, I felt safer in France than I typically do in America. And that led me to begin to meditate and pray about how that could be.

The answer is moralism. Moralism is a very dangerous threat to biblical Christianity. A person can be moral and not go to Heaven. Good works doesn't save us from our sins – only Jesus Christ can do that. France is a moral nation, but it is not a Christian nation. Moralism led to the secularization and eventually the post-Christian culture of Western Europe. The same thing is happening in America, except that we are less moral in many ways.

Many Americans are moral but unsaved. Good but not born again. Good is not good enough! **Jesus said to Nicodemus in John 3: "Jesus answered and said to him, "Most assuredly, I say to you, unless one is born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God." (John 3:3).**

People are people. We all share the same need – the forgiveness of our sins through the shed blood of Jesus Christ. My prayer is that the world would see Jesus Christ, not as a religious and historical personality, but that we would see Him as John the Baptist saw Him. **"The next day John saw Jesus coming toward him, and said, "Behold! The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!" (John 1:29).**

Jesus Christ is our only hope.


A Message from Barry Agnew, Jr., Minister of Students and Education

"There's even talk about refurbishing my family's pew." I don't like it one bit.
