Thoughts from our Pastor

The date for Easter is determined by the first Sunday after the full moon that occurs on or after the spring equinox; therefore, Easter can only occur in the season of spring. The earliest it can come is March 22 and the latest is April 25. The last time Easter fell on March 22, was in 1818. The next time it will fall on March 22, will be 2285. The last time Easter

fell on April 25, was 1943. The next time it will fall on April 25, will be 2038. This year, Easter came rather early, March 31.

Easter, of course, is the celebration of the resurrection of Jesus Christ. It relates to the Jewish Passover holiday in that the last time Jesus celebrated the Seder meal with His disciples was on the evening before the beginning of the Passover Feast. That is why that meal is sometimes referred to as the Last Supper. In fact, Leonardo da Vinci's famous painting (1498) of Jesus' last Passover meal with His apostles is named "The Last Supper." The resurrection of Jesus Christ changed everything! It validated the time change that was initiated at the incarnation of God (Christmas). It is reflected by the new life that spring brings to God's creation. But the resurrection is only the beginning of this marvelous change.

Why would the pastor write an article about the resurrection after Easter? I'm glad you asked. We must do a little grammar study to understand the answer to that question. Matthew 28:6; Mark 16:6 and Luke 24:5 all use the same grammar. Luke's version is a little easier for us to see the significance of the grammar. Luke 24:6 - "He is **not here, but is risen!**" English translations like this one (NKJV) help us with some important theological work. The Greek word for "Is risen" is egerthe. That verb is written in the agrist tense, indicative mood and the passive voice. The agrist tense is simply something that has happened in the past. The indicative mood is simply a statement of fact. So the transliteration is "Has risen" or "Was raised." The simple fact is that Jesus is no longer dead, He was raised from the dead to new life. That is a historical fact. It is the passive voice that changes everything. "Has risen" could be interpreted as Jesus simply got up from the grave - He did it Himself. However, in the grammatical construction of the resurrection account in the synoptic gospels, that is an incorrect conclusion. It is incorrect grammatically and theologically. The passive voice in the resurrection account indicates that God raised Jesus' human body from the dead. In other words, the resurrection of Jesus was the object of an action of God. The awesome thing about that is Jesus is God!! The Bible study (for those who want to dig deeper is: Galatians 1:1; John 10:17-18 and Romans 8:11). God the Father raised Jesus' body from the dead (Galatians 1:1). God the Son raised Jesus' body from the dead (John 10:17-18). God the Holy Spirit raised Jesus' body from the dead (Romans 8:11). Jesus was raised by the power of God. He was raised by God on a particular Sunday morning and His resurrection power continues to this day and will forever. He is risen!

If you are a follower of Jesus Christ, the day that you surrendered your life to the Lordship of Christ, is the day you were raised to new life by the same power of God who raised Jesus!! In summation, Easter is a date on the calendar that has incredible power and eternal rewards. If you are a follower of Christ, welcome to abundant and eternal life!!!

Easter never ends!

Nobody could have known that God was going to use him to start a church that has reached hundreds of people for the gospel in one of the darkest cities in our country!
