# **Thoughts from our Pastor**

Heraclitus (ancient Greek philosopher) said "The only thing constant is change." Benjamin Franklin said, "When you're finished changing, you're finished."



I don't like change. I don't think many of us do. But the truth is, change *is* the one constant in life. And there are those times when change is welcomed. When we are relieved from a crisis we are grateful.

Revisiting Heraclitus, he taught that nature was always in motion (change). He famously noted a river as an example. A river is constantly flowing and impacting its environment through erosion while being impacted by rainfall and floods creating a constant change in its course.

Our lives reflect the same pattern. Sometimes our lives change through proactive decision-making while other changes are thrust upon us unexpectedly as the result of the actions of others or the diagnosis of a disease or even through the inevitable birthdays in the aging process.

It is important to recognize that God is the ultimate changer. While He is immutable (unchangeable in His nature), He is constantly bringing about change on His creation through His providence and sovereignty. Job's life changed when God allowed Satan to inflict pain upon him. Saul's life changed on the Damascus road. Jesus changed time. Jesus changed me. When Jesus changed the life of the woman at the well, her testimony to others changed an entire village. God is the ultimate changer.

Church is not immune to change. We are experiencing change at Northgate. Currently, we are experiencing changes in staff. Through the course of birthdays, Dennis informed us that it was time for him to transition (change) to the rewarding life of retirement. That change has led to the calling of a new Worship Leader, Matthew. Matthew will certainly lead worship differently (he plays the piano, not the guitar). Barry Agnew, Jr., Mandy and Gideon are experiencing change as they have sensed God's call to missions in church planting. That staff change will lead to another as Barry's responsibilities will need to continue under the leadership of someone else.

The Christian need not fear change. While it isn't always easy and comfortable, it is part of God's perfect plan. Our role is simple faithful obedience. When we seek God first, we are always making the right decision.

I'm really not a big fan of change. Then again I'm not sure many of us are. There's one thing I always have to remind myself of though. I always have to remember that at the end of the day God's will always be best. Even when His will calls us to uncomfortable change we trust that His will be for our good and for His glory.

When we read the Bible we often see that God is a sending God. From God's sending of Abram in Genesis 12 to the sending of His angel in Revelation 22, hundreds of examples portray God as a missionary, sending God. The Old Testament even ends with God promising, through the words of the prophet Malachi, to send a special messenger as the forerunner of the Messiah. "See, I am going to send my messenger" (Malachi 3:1). Then the New Testament opens with the arrival of that messenger in the person of John the Baptist described in the gospels as a man sent by God (John 1:6). All of this culminates for us in the Great Commission. A key part Matthew 28:19 is the word "go". When God calls us to make disciples He doesn't tell us to sit back and ask lost people to come to us. He calls us to go to them.

Here then is where I have to be obedient. The Lord has called me to go. It can be scary. It is definitely asking me to step out of my comfort zone, and while from a secular perspective it may seem like a very uncertain move, we have to remember that we serve a certain God. Mandy and I are trusting God's provision and His providence to glorify Him in His calling on our lives.

Now for Northgate I want to stress how beautiful of a thing that God has done. Northgate is sending us out to plant. It is God's church sending out missionaries to carry on a legacy. My heart's desire is to stay connected with God's church at Northgate and I believe that God is calling us to continue on in gospel partnership.
